


STAR WARS: EPISODE II ATTACK OF THE CLONES

Comic book text is short, but that doesn't mean students don't learn a lot from it! Comic books and graphic novels can be used to teach reading processes and writing techniques, such as pacing, as well as expand vocabulary. Use this PDF to help students get more out of their comic book reading.

Here are some of the projects you can give to your students to make comics educational and enjoyable!

CHARACTER RESEARCH

- Character Graph – Use the handout provided on page 2 to research information about a character from the books. Page 3 provides teachers with the answer key.
- Trivia Questions – Use the handout provided on page 4 to have students work independently, with a partner, or in a small group to research the trivia questions. Page 5 provides teachers with the answer key.

CREATIVE WRITING PROJECTS

- Create an Alien Species – Use the handout from page 6 to provide students the questions to answer in order to create the background information on their own alien species.
- Create a Graphic Novel – Use the handout from page 7 to form small groups and ask the groups to create their own graphic novels over the course of a week.

Create a GRAPHIC NOVEL

It takes many people to create a graphic novel. Writers and artists bring their talents together to create an illustrated story. You can work with your classmates to create a graphic novel.

Here's what you need:

- 1. WRITERS** - choose an author or two to write the story. Authors will work with the pencillers to decide narration, dialog, panel divisions, pacing, and descriptions of the art.
- 2. PENCILLERS** - choose artists to draw the panels in pencil. Pencillers will work with the authors to draw exactly what they envision. Pencillers will also work with letterers to provide enough space for the text and sound effects.
- 3. INKERS** - choose artists with a steady hand to outline the panels and important art in them. Inkers will work with the pencillers to decide what needs bold outlines.
- 4. COLORISTS** - choose detail-oriented people to color the inked panels. Colorists have to keep colors consistent throughout the panels. Colorists will work with writers and pencillers to get the correct colors in the panels.
- 5. LETTERERS** - choose someone to insert the narration and dialog into the panels. Letterers work with pencillers to make sure there is enough room for the text. Letterers also work with the writers to make sure the text is in the correct place.
- 6. PRODUCTION MANAGER** - one person will need to oversee the entire project. He or she will coordinate the different team members and make sure they are able to talk to each other. The production manager will also create a schedule and make sure each team member follows it to complete the novel.

Archducal Box - the place where the archduke, or ruler of planet Geonosis, sits.

Army of the Republic - the main part of the armed forces of the Galactic Republic; also called Clone Army or Republic Army.

battle droid - a robot that fight in battles.

bounty hunter - a person hired to track down and kill someone for pay.

chancellor - the head of the government; also known as Supreme Chancellor.

changeling - a species that can change its appearance or shape; also called a shapeshifter.

Clone Army - the main part of the Galactic Republic's armed forces; also known as the Grand Army of the Republic or the Republic Army.

clone troopers - armies of matching clones created to serve in the Grand Army of the Republic during the Clone Wars.

cloners - beings that practice cloning, which is the identical genetic copying of organisms.

clones - genetically identical copies of organisms.

Commerce guild - a company that controls money and trading of goods throughout the galaxy.

Confederacy - the government and separatist movement that planned to leave the Galactic Republic. It was led by Count Dooku and was also known as the Confederacy of Independent Systems, the Separatist Confederacy, and the New Order.

Corporate Alliance - one of the Republic's commerce guilds, which are companies that control money and trading of goods throughout the galaxy.

Coruscant - a planet in the center of the galaxy. It was the seat of government for the Galactic Republic and the Galactic Empire.

council - refers to the Jedi Council, which is a group of 12 wise and powerful Jedi Masters elected to lead the Jedi.

Count Dooku - a Jedi Master who became a Dark Lord known as Darth Tyranus.

droid - a robot.

droid army - an army of robots used for battle.

droid foundries - factories where droids, or robots, are made.

droid soldiers - robot soldiers.

Galactic Senate - a decision-making group made up of senators, people who represent the Galactic Republic.

generator tower - a large tower for creating electricity.

Geonosians - beings from planet Geonosis, which is a harsh, rocky planet that is home to two major droid factories.

Geonosis - a harsh, rocky planet that is home to two major droid factories.

Grand Master - the head of the Jedi Order, which is a group of protectors who believe in using the light side of the Force.

Jedi - a member of the Jedi Order who studies the Force.

Jedi Council - a group of 12 wise and powerful Jedi Masters elected to lead the Jedi.

Jedi Knight - the rank of Jedi in the Jedi Order before Jedi Master.

Jedi Temple - the main base of the Jedi Order, which is a group of beings who believe in using the light side of the Force.

Kamino - a planet with lots of oceans and storms. It is where the clone army for the Galactic Republic was created.

Kamino superdart - a toxic dart created by the beings of planet Kamino.

Kamino system - a group of stars that contains planet Kamino.

kouhuns - small, silent, fast bugs that have a poisonous bite.

laser - a weapon connected to small spaceships that blasts out bursts of beam energy.

- Legislature Youth Program** - a galaxy-wide group that consists of children who want to enter public service.
- lightsaber** - a weapon of the Jedi that lets out a powerful beam of light. It is also called a laser sword.
- Loyalist Committee** - a group created within the Galactic Senate formed by Supreme Chancellor Palpatine.
- Master** - referring to Jedi Master, which is the second-highest rank a Jedi can obtain. A Jedi is a member of the Jedi Order who studies the Force.
- moisture farmer** - one who harvests water on dry planets such as Tatooine.
- moisture vaporator** - a device used on dry planets such as Tatooine to harvest extra water in the air.
- Moons of Bogden** - the many moons of planet Bogden, which is orbited by at least 20 moons.
- Naboo** - a planet with plains, swamps, and seas.
- oasis camp** - a camp set up by Tusken Raiders where prisoners were taken; also called a Tusken Raider camp.
- Padawan** - a person who is in training under a Jedi Knight or a Jedi Master; also called a Padawan learner or an apprentice Jedi.
- parsecs** - distance measurements. One parsec equals about 3.26 light-years.
- prime minister** - the head of the state or government for a planetary system.
- Republic** - the galaxy government before the Galactic Empire was established; also called Galactic Republic.
- Republic attack gunships** - battle craft that send out fast-shooting lasers and rockets against the droid, or robot, forces of the Separatists.
- Rishi Maze** - a small galaxy that circles the main galaxy and is hard to navigate in; also known as Companion Aurek.
- saber** - also known as lightsaber, which is a weapon of the Jedi that lets out a powerful beam of light. It is also called a laser sword.
- senator** - a being who stands for his or her planet, system, or sector.
- Senior Representative** - an official of the Galactic Senate who stands for a sector, system, or planet.
- Separatist movement** - a group that planned to leave the Galactic Republic and was led by Count Dooku.
- Separatists** - people in the Separatist movement, which was a group that planned to leave the Galactic Republic and was led by Count Dooku.
- Sith** - a group that uses the dark side of the Force and tries to destroy the Jedi.
- Slave I** - an attack spacecraft used by Jango Fett and his cloned son Boba.
- space freighter** - a spacecraft used to transport freight or cargo.
- spice miners** - people who mine, or dig for, spice.
- Subterrel** - a planet known for mining.
- Supreme Chancellor** - the head of the Galactic Republic.
- Tatooine** - a desert planet and homeworld to Luke Skywalker.
- Theed** - the capital city of planet Naboo.
- Tipoca City** - the capital city of planet Kamino.
- Trade Federation** - a business and trade group at the time of the Galactic Republic.
- Trade Federation Battleship** - a large ship built for the Trade Federation's sea forces.
- Trade Federation ships** - a type of spaceship used by the Trade Federation, which is a business and trade group at the time of the Galactic Republic.
- Tusken Raiders** - people of a culture that is native to planet Tatooine; also called Sand People or Tusks.
