HOW DID YOU START?

Create a GRAPHIC NOVEL

It takes many people to create a graphic novel. Writers and artists bring their talents together to create an illustrated story. You can work with your classmates to create a graphic novel.

Here's what you need:

- **1. WRITERS** choose an author or two to write the story. Authors will work with the pencillers to decide narration, dialog, panel divisions, pacing, and descriptions of the art.
- 2. PENCILLERS choose artists to draw the panels in pencil. Pencillers will work with the authors to draw exactly what they envision. Pencillers will also work with letterers to provide enough space for the text and sound effects.
- **3. INKERS** choose artists with a steady hand to outline the panels and important art in them. Inkers will work with the pencillers to decide what needs bold outlines.
- **4. COLORISTS** choose detail-oriented people to color the inked panels. Colorists have to keep colors consistent throughout the panels. Colorists will work with writers and pencillers to get the correct colors in the panels.
- **5. LETTERERS** choose someone to insert the narration and dialog into the panels. Letterers work with pencillers to make sure there is enough room for the text. Letterers also work with the writers to make sure the text is in the correct place.
- 6. PRODUCTION MANAGER one person will need to oversee the entire project. He or she will coordinate the different team members and make sure they are able to talk to each other. The production manager will also create a schedule and make sure each team member follows it to complete the novel.

Alderaan - a planet with grasslands and mountains.

command ship - the ship where the people in charge are in and give their orders from.

commander - a military rank or title.

Coruscant - a planet in the center of the galaxy. It was the seat of government for the Galactic Republic and the Galactic Empire.

Council - refers to the Jedi Council, which is a group of 12 wise and powerful Jedi Masters elected to lead the Jedi.

Dagobah - a planet of swamps and forests in the Outer Rim Territories.

dischargers - devices that controlled the output of energy.

droid - a robot.

droid army - an army of robots used for battle.

emperor - a title held by certain officials or heads of state.

escape pods - small ships inside of a large ship used to get out in emergencies.

Felucia - a planet in the Outer Rim Territories that was covered by forests of fungus and was a major base for the Separatists during the Clone Wars.

Galactic Empire - the government established by Supreme Chancellor Palpatine to replace the Galactic Republic and bring Sith rule to the galaxy; also called the Empire.

Galactic Senate - a decision-making group made up of senators, people who represent the Galactic Republic.

Galaxies Opera House - a famous opera house on Coruscant.

general - a high-level military rank.

Jedi - a member of the Jedi Order who studies the Force.

Jedi Council - a group of 12 wise and powerful Jedi Masters elected to lead the Jedi.

Jedi homing beacon - a device carried by members of the Jedi Order that allows them to receive word from the Jedi Temple on Coruscant.

Jedi Knight - the rank of Jedi in the Jedi Order before Jedi Master.

Jedi Order - an organization focused on keeping the peace and understanding and gaining knowledge in the light side of the Force.

Jedi Temple - the main base of the Jedi Order, which is a group of protectors who believe in using the light side of the Force.

Jedi Temple Hangar - any place that a ship can land inside or around the Jedi Temple.

Kashyyyk - a planet covered by forests and jungles in the Mid Rim and home world to the Wookiees.

Master - referring to Jedi Master, which is the second-highest rank a Jedi can obtain. A Jedi is a member of the Jedi Order who studies the Force.

midi-chlorians - tiny life forms that live inside the cells of all living things. The more midi-chlorians a person has in their cells, the more sensitive to the Force they are.

Mustafar - a planet in the Outer Rim Territories covered by volcanoes and lava rivers. During the Clone Wars, Mustafar was used to mine lava to build droids and was also the hiding place for the Separatist leaders after the death of Count Dooku.

Mustafar System - a star system in the Outer Rim Territories with 5 planets.

Mygeeto - a planet in the Outer Rim Territories that was controlled by the Separatists in the Clone Wars.

Naboo - a planet with plains, swamps, and seas.

Planet Utapau - a planet in the Outer Rim Territories that features large canyons and underground oceans. Polis Massa - a field of asteroids that served as a hiding spot for the Jedi and other Republic loyalists after creation of the Galactic Empire.

Republic - the galaxy government before the Galactic Empire was established; also called Galactic Republic.

Sand people - Sand People, or Tusken Raiders, are a native people of Tatooine and live as clans in the desert.

Senate - a decision-making group made up of people who represent their planet or system.

Senate Arena - the large room where members of the senate would gather to talk about laws and plans.

Separatists - people in the Separatist movement, which was a group that planned to leave the Galactic Republic and was led by Count Dooku.

Separatist Council - a group made up of the Separatist leaders to discuss and talk about plans.

Sith - a group that uses the dark side of the Force and tries to destroy the Jedi.

Sith Lord - a powerful master of Sith knowledge.

Tatooine - a desert planet and home world to Luke Skywalker.

Utapau - a planet in the Outer Rim Territories that features large canyons and underground oceans.

Wookiees - shaggy giants from the planet Kashyyyk.
