### **Another View**

Chapter Three discusses the Battle of Lexington. Imagine you are living in Lexington when you learn that the British soldiers are marching toward your town. The men of the town are going to stand up to the soldiers. Do you want to join them too? What feelings might you have waiting in the dark for the soldiers to arrive?
